## Who Do We Think We Are?

**Who and what is East Yorkshire? Where did we come from? What has influenced us in the past? Who and what will Hull and East Riding be in the future?**

**Who Do We Think We Are?** is the new East Riding initiative that links various aspects of the identity and diversity strand of the national curriculum. Aimed at all key stages, it launched in December 2008. The annual WDWTWA week happens in schools across the country every June. East Riding is working in partnership with Hull University's Wilberforce Institute for the study of Slavery and Emancipation (WISE) and Hull & East Riding museums. In 2008-2009, 10 pilot schools got the project off to a flying start and now more are coming on board as the word spreads.

The culmination of the pilot project was a **Hands-On History** family day at Holy Trinity Church in Hull. Hundreds of members of the public came to research **Who Do You Think You Are?** There was opportunity to search the parish records and climb the church tower. Horse-drawn carriage rides and Victorian costumes helped to set the scene. Some WDWTWA schools displayed and performed their work.

WDWTWA is set to take off in a big way in the future - **REaction** and **faith2faith** are part of it. So too are various community cohesion, global and multicultural aspects of the curriculum. Each school chooses its own local application and areas of focus.

Schools are exploring links between East Riding and Rio, Cape Town and Western Australia.

The previous evening, Bishop Richard of Hull launched the *Spirit of East Yorkshire: Images of Religion* exhibition celebrating the diversity of faith that makes up our East Yorkshire identity. *The Spirit banners are available for loan to schools.*

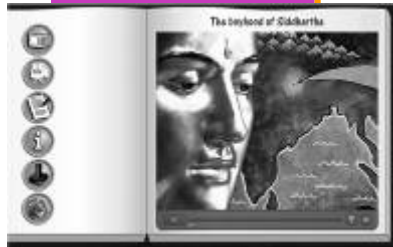

**It's what all RE teachers are still waiting for! ...** the East Riding user-friendly guide to **RE assessment**.

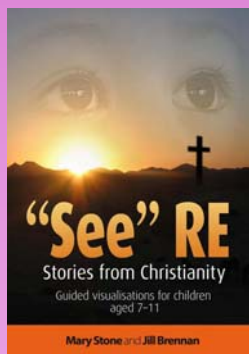
Our Assessment Working Group is working with other teachers from Hull and East Riding to exemplify the 8 levels with classroom best practice. Schools are collaboratively working to moderate pupils' work for **reweb**. The aim is to put in more cross-

curricular references, thereby paving the way to the next agreed syllabus of 2011. Five LAs, including York, hope to produce a common syllabus with cross-curricular units of work. We are working with QCDA to align with other RE syllabuses in England.

For TAs and HLTAs, NQTs and others who may need a refresher, there is a general Agreed Syllabus training on

**February 2 at Tickton Grange**. Assessment will be discussed along with ideas for being creative with RE.

**REaction09** took the theme of **faith2faith: The Journey of Life**. In 5 venues and on 11 lively days in June, around 2200 young people, adults and local church members came together to explore aspects of faith. What are the values would you put in **your** suitcase of life? Pupils celebrated 'what it means to be me' linking neatly with **Who Do We Think We Are?** and identity & diversity issues.

In 2010, 12 days will be once more be offered at 6 venues. Facilitators are working on a **Hopes & Dreams** theme. Invita-

Now it's the turn of the primary curriculum for a makeover! The consultation ran from April to July and we are getting ready for the final report, due soon. Together with the recommendations of the Rose Review, came draft updated non-statutory guidance 'RE in English Schools'. It's the first time since 1994 that there has been new national guidance on RE, and it's not before time! The document is aimed at LAs through their SACREs, at local faith communities, school governors and teachers. It is intended to provide a clear point of reference, to inform and guide, not to direct, and to generate confidence in the capacity of RE to enrich the curriculum offered to young people. The **legislation** governing the provision of RE remains the same, but the **guidance** reflects the contemporary context of RE in schools today.

East Riding is adamant that national guidance will be reflected in our next Agreed Syllabus. The plan is to work towards delivering RE in tandem with the new curriculum, due in 2011.
